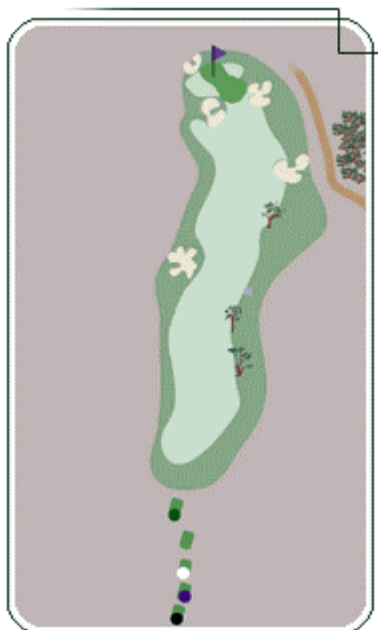

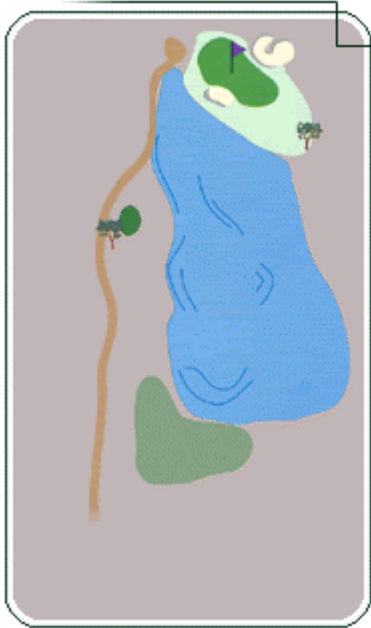

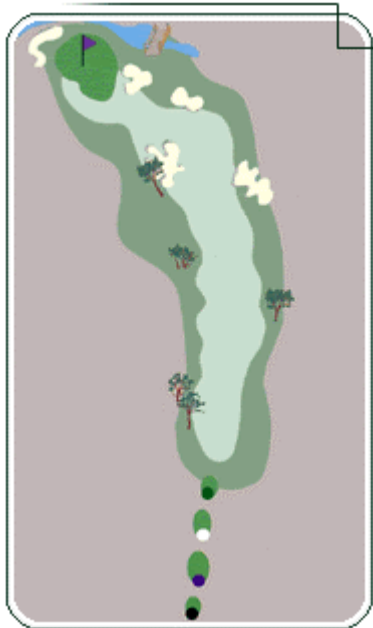
Long par 4 is best played down left side as fairway contour will bring ball back to center. Due to length most approaches will be long irons and woods to this long and narrow green. Middle to high handicappers might consider playing the hole to reach the green in 3.

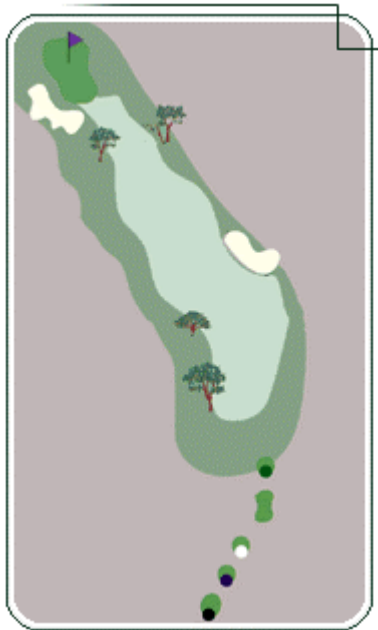
This par 3 is best played to center of green regardless of pin placement due to carry over waterfront and left of green. Take note of right to left prevailing breeze.

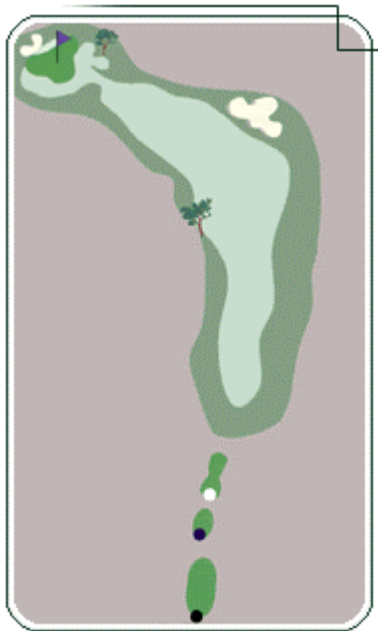
This par 5 is reachable in two by long hitters however odds are the trees on left or bunker front right of green will catch most second shots. Taking note of lay-up yardage for second shot will make for short to iron approaches to this well bunkered green with water behind it.

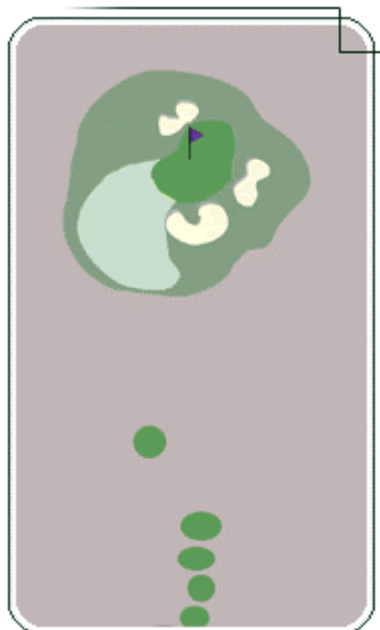
Long up hill par 4 will require long iron and wood approaches that are best played to the right side of green. A large bunker running front left to center of green catch any stray shots left

A long drive on the left side of this short uphill par 4 either carrying trees or staying left of bunker will leave a wedge to the green. Playing less than a driver off tee to right or left side fairway will take bunkers out of play and will result in a short but blind approach.

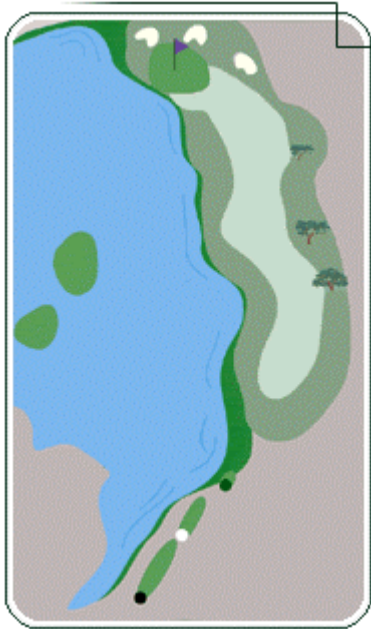
Club selection is crucial on this downhill par 3 with a downwind prevailing breeze. A miss left will be more forgiving than right.

A drive to left side of fairway sets up best approach to this long par 4 with a prevailing breeze behind you. A long down wind approach to this somewhat smaller green is best played at front left to feed to center.

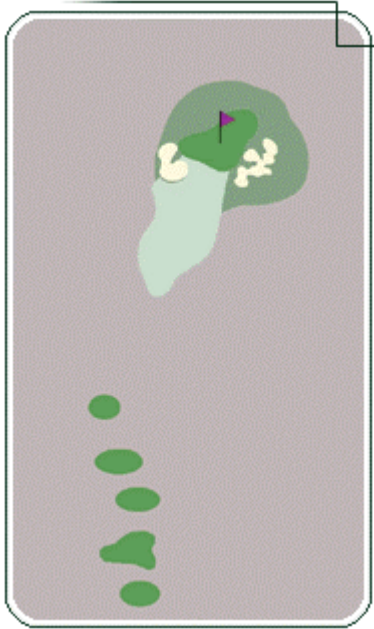
Choose conservative amount of lake to trim off due to prevailing breeze in your face. Take note of carry over water. Safe approach shot should be played to right side of green due to severe slope on the far right side taking water on left side green out of play.

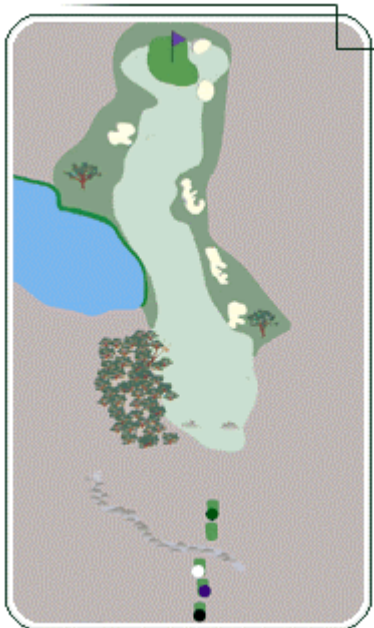
Target off tee is just left of large oak in center of fairway on this par 4. Right side tee shot will cause difficult approaches due to the encroaching tree line. Take note of yardage for approach shot to this well bunkered green.

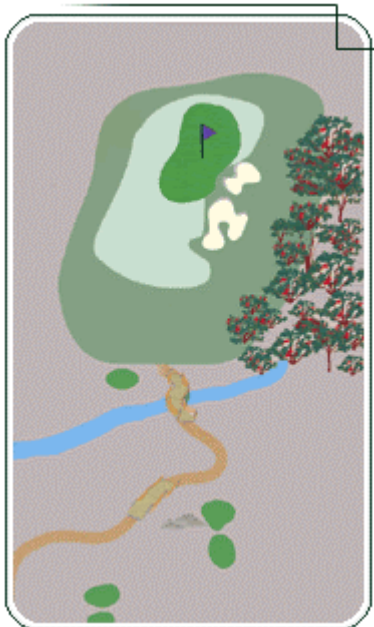
This tree-lined tee shot with trouble from deep brush and lateral hazard left of fairway and mature oaks right make for a difficult tee shot on this long par 5. Short second shots encounter water all along left side and bunkers all along right. Long and narrow green makes for difficult club selection on approach.



Granite

A drive right center fairway proves safest off tee although a long drive left side avoiding wetlands provides ideal approach to this scenic short par 4. Be careful not to lose approach shots to the right as green drops off into wetland.

Take note of tee box as back tees offer a slightly uphill approach as opposed to the front tees offering a severe uphill carry to a large green on this par 3. Safe tee shot is to left center green avoiding severe drop-off to deep rough and wetlands right and bunkers front and right.



Bridge

A seemingly treacherous tee shot offers a wide landing area on this 3 shot par 5. A smart second shot has you laying back just behind the 100 yard marker where the fairway narrows and fairway bunkers extend out from the green up to 60 yards.



Crunch Time

A drive right side fairway offers the least difficult approach on this memorable par 4 which plays into the prevailing breeze. Be sure to take enough club on approach to carry the fronting creek and bunkers guarding the green.



Homestretch

A tee shot down right side carrying bunker sets up this uphill into the breeze par 4. Best approach shots take advantage of right-to-left topography surrounding this long green. Take special note of length of green and pin placement as this will affect approach shot 1-2 clubs.



Hang Time

Although long, this par 4 plays downhill and downwind which plays to your advantage off the tee but requires accurate club selection to hit this green in regulation. Approach shot is better missed left than right on this well bunkered green.
